

# Hole in the Head: The Battle for Bodega Bay and the Birth of the Environmental Movement

## **Student Activity:**

- *Optional:* Show examples of protest posters. You can use your own examples or use the PDF labeled, "Protest Posters for Hole in the Head Student Activity" under Teacher Resources on the Sonoma County Museum website.
- Divide the group into half; one side will be anti-nuclear power plant and the other side will be pro-nuclear power plant.
- Have them break up into smaller groups to discuss pros and cons
- Come up with a slogan
- Come up with ideas for the artwork or photo for a poster to promote their positions.
- Afterwards, share ideas.
- With different art materials, students can proceed to create their own protest posters

For younger children, have them debate something simpler, like hamburgers vs. hot dogs.

The students can make protest posters based on their discussion and ideas during the student activity.

Have them debate other topics, e.g., school uniforms vs. regular clothes, TV vs. books, wiki-leaks vs. homeland security.
